Uniform observance

The temptation to add **jewellery** and gorgeous **nails** is completely understandable for party outfits but do, please, ensure that these do not make an appearance in school. Attendance - Information from our Therapeutic Team Lead - Mrs Sayers

Regular school attendance is, of course, now more important than ever. This now means, our usual rules for attendance apply as follows:

- It is the duty of parents and carers to ensure that their child attends regularly and on time.
- The Academy has responsibility to record attendance, and follow up absences.
- The Academy will offer appropriate support for your child's education, attendance, wellbeing and wider development, working closely with other professions when necessary and appropriate.

• The Academy is expected to issue sanctions, including Penalty Notices in line with the Local Authority's codes of conduct and Government quidelines.

Attendance figures are shared regularly with the Local Authority. Children should strive to achieve 100% attendance at all times; attendance should not drop below the Academy's target of 97%. The grid below helps to explain how attendance is evaluated.

Children whose attendance has fallen below target previously will automatically have their attendance monitored. We understand that there may be extenuating circumstances which is why we monitor attendance on an individual basis. You may receive a letter about your child's attendance, please feel free to contact the academy.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our attendance procedures:

- If your child is suffering from any Covid symptoms and have a positive LFT or PCR test, they should remain at home for 3 days. The first day of symptoms is still classed as day 0.
- If your child is very ill, then please notify the Office Staff/Attendance Team on: 0113 2533504 before 9.00 am. Please advise us of the reason for absence on **each day** of absence.
- On occasions throughout the week members of the Attendance Team and other school staff may visit any child
 who is absent from school. If your child is well enough to attend, your child will be expected to attend school for
 the remainder of that day.
- If your child is absent from school for **5 days or longer**, you are required to provide medical evidence i.e. an Appointment Card, indicating the reason for absence. Failure to do so will result in the absence being unauthorised. A home visit will be carried out on day 4.
- Please arrange all medical appointments outside the school day, wherever possible. If the appointment is unavoidable, the Academy expects your child to attend before and/or after the appointment as a full day cannot be authorised. Please provide a copy of the appointment letter for our records.
- All requests for holidays in term-time must be <u>unauthorised</u> and may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued by the Local Authority. A form to request holidays and/or absence for exceptional circumstances is available from the office. Please check our Attendance Policy on our website for guidance on absence in term time.

I am obliged to inform you that under the provision of Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, parents/carers are legally responsible for ensuring their children attend school regularly and on time. Failure to do so could result in the issue of a Penalty Notice or legal proceedings being taken by the Local Authority.

The Academy shares the Government's determination to raise the levels of pupil attendance at school because we want to give the best future opportunities for all our pupils. If you are experiencing any difficulties with your child's attendance, please contact school at the earliest opportunity.

We thank you for your continued support with attendance, working together promotes the best early life chances for your child to fulfil their potential.

Health and Safety - Cycling/Scooter Helmets, Pedestrians and Mini Police!

Please do continue to be mindful of Health and Safety and the need to wear **protective helmets** if riding scooters or cycling to and from school. Whilst the school, of course, have no legal jurisdiction or capacity to enforce this, we do hope that our additional curricular provision involving 'Bikeability' is helping to keep our children safe by influencing good habits.

Children, please remember, we cannot allow cycling or scooting on the playground at drop off and collection times due to the congestion at these times, the slope of the playground and the risk of collisions with other children and parents. Thank you all for your understanding with this.
