Dear Parents, Carers and Colleagues

Hot weather warning and actions

Current forecasts show a significant spike in temperatures on Monday and Tuesday next week, with a high of 36 degrees predicted. (Seriously... some of us are way too old for those temperatures in England!) However, to ensure that children are as comfortable and safe as possible in school, we be taking the following measures:

Clothing:

- Our uniform policy will be temporarily *relaxed*. Children should wear either lighter-fitting PE kits, summer dresses or similar on Monday and Tuesday.

- All children will be asked to bring a brimmed hat / cap to school to wear outside.

Water:

- Children can bring in additional water bottles and will be able to access and refill these throughout the day.

Sun Cream:

We will require children to apply sun cream before any break times in addition to cream applied before school (minimum SPF 15). Alternatively, all-day oil-based products could be applied before school. Please send sun creams labelled with your child's name. Younger children will be supervised applying their own sun cream.
For a small number of children who are unable to apply their own sun cream, a parental permission slip will be sent home in order for staff to assist.

- If children do not bring in hats / sun cream, they will not be allowed to play on the main playground.

Activities:

- Outdoor PE / games involving vigorous movement will not take place in heat above 30 degrees.

- Where possible, extra air-flow devices will be used within school.

Year 6 Performance

Our extremely talented Year 6 children are busy rehearsing for their performance of '*Aladdin Trouble'* and they are looking forward to showing you their performing arts skills next week.

The performances are taking place on Monday 18th July at 6.00 pm and again on Tuesday 19th July at 1.30 pm. To try and minimise the heat, we are able to welcome <u>a maximum of two people</u> for each performance to come along and enjoy the show.

The Mayor of Morley, Councillor Oliver Newton, will be joining us for the evening performance. Our thanks go to Councillor Newton for visiting Westerton in our Whole School Assembly this week when he shared with the children his inspirational personal journey from being a School Councillor at Westerton for Scatcherd, through his secondary education at Woodkirk, undertaking a law apprenticeship with a law firm in Leeds to becoming a Councillor for Morley and now, at 27 years of age, the youngest Mayor on record. Incredible! The children thoroughly enjoyed questioning the Councillor about his priorities, his plans and tips for their own success.

That is it for now, not sure if we will get round to a newsletter next week but we will try. Have a lovely weekend everyone and watch out for that sun.


