This week...

Our Spring Term debate finals took place. Children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 debated exceptionally well.

The year 3 debate considered whether or not the Roman invasion had a positive impact on Britain. The winning team who were 'for' this motion included Haris, Daisy and Hugo who provided great opening arguments, shared key facts based on research and developed counter arguments. The year 4 debate winners were Henry, Archie and Alana who debated if it were our job to save the environment. They were against the motion and raised confident and detailed points.

Simran, Daniel and Ben were our winning year 5 debate team. They considered whether or not children should study mathematics until the age of 18. Being against this motion, the children shared information on the implications on mental health and confidence alongside knowledge of the mathematical development of children in education. Year 6 debated whether or not teachers should carryout strike action. Whilst both debate teams put forward key facts, relevant information and rebuffed the points made by the opposing team, Finley and Ava were judged to have won the debate based on their counter arguments.




Challenge of the Week
